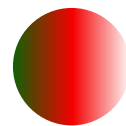

Under the theme “**Cultivating Global Citizen Skill through Research and Education: Development of Critical Thinking, Creativity, Communication and Global Collaboration**” International Conference on Education 2025 seeks to facilitate meaningful discussions and collaborations around current issues, trends, and challenges in education, as well as showcase innovative research and practices. By bringing together a diverse group of professionals from around the world, the conference aims to foster a deeper understanding of the field, inspire new ideas and approaches, and contribute to the advancement of education globally.



Conference overview

ICEDU 2025, the 11th International Conference on Education 2025 was held under the theme, “**Cultivating Global Citizen Skill through Research and Education: Development of Critical Thinking, Creativity, Communication and Global Collaboration**”. This theme was thoughtfully designed to address the most pressing challenges within the field of Education in the current context of the world. In alignment with this theme, the paper submission tracks spanned a broad range of topics.

Global Reach

This year, ICEDU welcomed submissions from over **50 countries** across Asia, Africa, Europe, and beyond. The most significant number of papers came from Asia, underscoring the region's growing academic engagement. Reflecting global reach, the conference welcomed participants from over **44 countries**, including:

More than **100 universities** were represented, and the participant pool was equally diverse in roles and expertise including, University leadership (Deans, Heads of Departments), Faculty members and academic researchers, Doctoral and postgraduate students, Civil service professionals, Social and community activists.
